WATCH OUT FOR COMMUNICATION LINES

Equipment connected via communication lines such as ethernet and phone are especially susceptible to surges as they may propagate from areas away from the home





BE AWARE OF DOWN EQUIPMENT

Ilf a surge does occur in the home, beware of essential equipment that may be down. Many of those who receive surges experience loss in power and thus loose essential emergency equipment such as smoke, carbon monoxide, and radon detectors, security systems, and fire alarms



IF LOSS OF POWER

In the case of loss of power, keep items necessary for safety such as a flashlight, and a small radio to listen for emergency information. If a powerline, or any other essential electrical equipment is damaged, exposed, or has fallen, call your utility company immediately.
